He played nick-nack on my shoe; (two fingers tap a shoe)
With a nick-nack paddy whack,
Give a dog a bone,
This old man came rolling home.
3. This old man, he played three,
He played nick-nack on my knee... (three fingers tap knee)
4. This old man, he played four,
He played nick-nack on my door... (knock forehead)
5. This old man, he played five,
He played nick-nack on my hive... (wiggle fingers for flying bees)
6. This old man, he played six,
He played nick-nack on my sticks... (tap index fingers)
7. This old man, he played seven,
He played nick-nack up in heaven... (point skyward)
8. This old man, he played eight,
He played nick-nack on my gate... (knock on an imaginary gate)
9. This old man, he played nine,
He played nick-nack on my spine... (tap on a spine/backbone)
10. This old man, he played ten,
He played nick-nack once again... (clap hands)
